Sept. 7, 2018 "Managing Subclinical Hypothyroidism" Linda Lester, MD, Associate Professor of Medicine, Division of Endocrinology, Diabetes and Clinical Nutrition, OHSU School of Medicine **Objectives:** 1) Identify which patients should be started on thyroid hormone therapy 2) Discuss types of thyroid hormone therapy currently being used, and identify recommended therapies 3) Identify how to monitor patients and adjust their doses to target an appropriate thyroid hormone level

Sept. 14, 2018 "Proactive Management of Prediabetes" Stefan Bughi, MD, Associate Professor of Medicine, Division of Endocrinology, Keck School of Medicine of USC **Objectives:** 1) Define prediabetes 2) List risk factors and clinical signs in individuals at risk for type 2 diabetes, including age, ethnic background, history of gestational diabetes, being overweight or obese, low physical activity, and a family history of diabetes 3) Identify interventions to modify risk factors in preventing type 2 diabetes 4) Develop a strategic management plan to proactively screen, assess, follow-up and evaluate patients with prediabetes, particularly prediabetes caused by insulin resistance.

Sept. 21, 2018 "Update in Outpatient Medicine" Robert Gluckman, MD, Internal Medicine Specialist, Chief Medical Officer, Providence Health Plans **Objectives:** 1) Understand the risks and benefits of the new Herpes Zoster vaccine 2) Apply the new ACC/AHA Hypertension guidelines 3) Understand the benefits and cost difference of insulin analogs vs. human insulin 4) Understand the risk of screening colonoscopy findings to determine recommendations for interval exams.

Sept. 28, 2018 "Acupuncture: An Alternative to Opioid for Pain Relief" Tanuja Goulet, Doctor of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine, Licensed Acupuncturist Bend, OR) **Objectives:** 1) Interpret studies of acupuncture research in terms of efficacy and effectiveness for pain in short-term and long-term outcomes 2) Interpret studies of acupuncture research in terms of quality of life outcomes in short-term and long-term follow-up 3) Apply acupuncture research concepts to assist in recommending non-drug treatment for complex patients with chronic pain 4) Use presentation concepts to counsel patients on choices in their care 5) Review pain conditions that do not respond to acupuncture

Oct. 5, 2018 "An Update on Medical Use of Cannabis (with a focus on new study results)" Jacci Bainbridge, Pharm.D., University of Colorado Denver, Skaggs School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences **Objectives:** 1) Review the pharmacology of cannabis (including drug-drug interactions including salves and oils). 2) Identify the disease states which may be treated with cannabis. 3) Review current medical literature and studies on the medicinal efficacy of marijuana (evidence for and against effectiveness). 4) Describe communication strategies for prospective patients considering or using cannabis treatment. 5) Discuss a case study and patient experience with diagnosis, treatment and management.
